



The use of chemical protective gloves is one of the most common mechanisms used to prevent skin contact with huzardous chemicals. When you provide gloves to the workforce for use, you also need to provide training in how to use them. This might sound a bit silly if mean how hard is if to put on a pair of gloves? It but there are actually a lot of things that can go wrong when there is just a thin piece of material between you and a hazardous substance. Two common things that I see happen include falling to inspect them before putting them on and/or getting the hazardious substance on your skin whitst they are being taken off.

For example, take a look at the gloves in the photo below. One has the culfs stuck together (stranted you probably would have figured that one out without an inspection to one has faulty oulf mouiding, and one has a puncture hole in it. These were freshout of the manufacturers box, so it pays to inspect them before putting them on.


